In my annual contract, there is a section that says I have up to two weeks per year for continuing education. This is not exactly the norm for most UCC ministerial contracts. In fact, a great number of churches have done away with continuing education as a whole. (And a great number of pastors have quit engaging it as well!) Personally, I am so very grateful that St. John's is not one of those churches.

As a number of you reading this will know, I spend my continuing education weeks taking part in the Next Generation Leadership Initiative that is sponsored by the UCC's Pension Board. This program provides four years of in-depth classroom (graduate level) training, participation in two general synods, 360 degree feedback evaluation, and a host of other leadership development opportunities. Moreover, after classroom experience, the program provides a funded period of six years to engage further education as each minister sees fit. Some folks complete another degree, others take advanced seminars, but all walk away far more knowledgeable than when they started.

In January, I completed my first classroom session with NGLI. The course was over "Family Systems Theory" and the psycho-analytical principles of Murray Bowen and others. To make a long story short, it was a very intense, though very life-giving, week. While I definitely enjoyed

a wee bit of warmer weather —as the class was in Phoenix

AZ—it certainly was anything but a vacation. More than Simply a mind mash, this course provided great insight Into leading diverse people and providing "non-anxious" leadership in trying times. (All things that I was happy to share with council upon my return.) This summer, I'll journey to Baltimore to take part in the church's general synod and I'm sure I'll return with even more to share.



So thank you St. John's, I hope that your care for me will in-turn reap benefits for us all!



STIVERS PROGRAM

If you have been in church for the last year, you are aware of the regular Sunday participation in our choir by two Stivers High School students Logan Van Bibber and Camryn Snapp. The program began in January 2016 when funding was provided by donations from several of our church families through May. Parking Ministry provided funding for October through early February 2017. Those of our members who have a particular interest in music, our choir or further funding of our student participants are encouraged to become supporters of the program. Envelopes marked 'Stivers Sponsor' are available on the table in the narthex for you to pick up. Gifts may be 'in honor of', 'memory of', 'sponsor',etc. Each student is here Sunday 9:30 through 1:00. That's two rehearsals and one worship service and each receives \$40 per Sunday. \$80 per Sunday or \$320



per month for both students on a 4 Sunday month with perfect attendance. We are not suggesting amounts; the figures are to let you know what the program requires. Any amount will certainly be appreciated. Some contributions have already been received.

Our Worship staff and committee believe this to be a valuable program for both St. John's and the young people. The choir has the support of trained voices while our students receive experience working with a choir in a religious setting, exposure to sacred music. learning to direct and lead a choir all with direction from a professional musician. Not to forget, we see this as another effort of St. John's to establish contact within our local community.
