I don't want to dash any long-held perceptions, but that's not necessarily what I think of when it comes to the topic of discipleship.

Instead of being an intimidating or torturous exercise in "do this/don't do this, say this/don't say this," I see discipleship as something far simpler. On Thursday evenings, we will be providing a time and a space to practice contemplative Chris-

tian practices that have been part of the church for centuries. We'll learn to sit quietly, pray in new and different ways, and discuss what it means to wait or listen for God. (Amongst other things!)



Our journeying with God will also stretch to our Sunday morning worship. The Worship Committee has been plotting and scheming some interesting ways to connect each of us to our worship in new and exciting manners. What are those? Well, you'll have to pop out and see!

In closing, I hope this Lenten season provides for each of us the opportunities to journey deeper into discipleship and journey deeper with Almighty God.

Budget & Finance Committee

The Budget and Finance Committee met on Sunday, February 5th at 9:15 a.m. with Ron Duckson being confirmed as the Vice Chair of the Committee.

The January 2017 Treasurer's Report was presented with General Offerings up by \$6,672 over the prior year (partially due to some prior year offerings not being deposited and accounted for until February last year). Expenses were a bit on the high side due to the first quarter Insurance that was due and a large Vectren bill which will be reviewed to determine why there was such a high increase when the weather did not warrant it. The Treasurer did raise a concern that if expenses continued at the current rate, at the end of the 12-month period we would exceed the Endowment funds advanced by about \$2,500. A separate RAM account has been set up to account for costs expended for the organ that will be paid out of the organ donation account. Income from the Merrill Lynch sale was received in January 2017 but was for the 2016 sale of

the funds and does not count toward the \$65,000 from the Memorial Endowment funds for this year. \$245 was received for sponsor of the Stivers Students. A \$3,500 payment received for the ESOL program with another expected later in the year. Payroll fees were up due to preparation and mailing of W2's. RAMM payment made of \$900 for the Security System/ Monitoring. There was a decline in fund values noted and question raised as the market has been in an upward movement. While an answer was not readily available, it will be looked into.



The organ status was discussed and other items that are being considered or covered in other areas including: Safe Church (background checking of Nursery staff), Website moving to a UCC sponsored provider, Stivers Fundraising, Daycare – My Father's House Childcare (ESOL) – Lease being drafted.

It was noted that Reverend Wirrig had a positive meeting with a representative of the Black Box Theater at which he was given a \$200 check in donation for the use of parking and that they hoped to have future donations as well.

The next meeting of the Committee is Sunday, March 5th at 9:15 a.m. Guests are welcome.


