The Budget & Finance Committee met Sunday May 13, 2018. Present at the meeting were: Patty Staley-Chair, Doug Goudy-Vice Chair, Nick Schumacher-Secretary, Jeff Gerrior-Treasurer, Ron Duckson, Debbie Watts, Reverend Wirrig and guest Kim Kindred.

The meeting was called to order by Patty Staley, Chair.

The minutes from the April 2018 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Jeff Gerrior reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the month of April 2018 noting that Offerings are up over 2017 for the month in the amount of \$612 and year-to-date \$6,700. Expenses were a little high but typical for this time of year due to building insurance, payroll and employee insurance and the gas bill still higher this month due the weather (this should now not be an issue as we go into the spring/summer months). The deficit continues to trend lower than budget and if we continue as we are, year-end should be well under budget. Requests from Parking Ministry were made and are reflected in the RAMM Holding Account, the Organ Fund Account and the Discretionary Mission Holding Account. The \$25,000 request from the GBU Annuity has been processed and is reflected in the April report. There was a \$3,000 gift to the RAMM Account. Interest was received in the amount of \$853 for the Memorial Endowment. Easter/Holy Week contributions came in totaling \$1,307. A SONKA grant in the amount of \$500 was received to support our Stivers Program. As was the final payment of \$3,500 for the ESOL program space use for the year. The Martial Arts group continues to donate for their use of space.

In old business, it was noted that the Council Chair is working on compiling

council member recommended revisions to the Constitution and By-Laws for discussion at Council. Parking & Parking Ministry – ABM has now taken on parking. The transition has been fairly smooth. We should see something in the next 30 days from them (report/payment). The search is continuing for a new Administrative Assistant has been temporarily placed on hold to reassess the needs of the position and possible posting at a later date. The Director of Family Life Ministries has a potential candidate that will be interviewed and Committee will be updated as it progresses.

Stewardship and Legacy Giving were discussed. Each of the members will revise a section from last year's Stewardship program to personalize it and make it more about St. John's and more inviting to the congregation to use as the budgeting tool it was meant to be. Committee members will also review the Legacy Giving pamphlet prepared last year and make any recommendations for changes that need to be made.

Grants & Fundraising – The Committee revisited the need to be diligently reviewing grants and other fundraising options. While the focus will be building (interior and exterior) and ADA Compliance any funds that can be utilized by the Church should be considered including energy grants, program grants, etc. Patty is working on the matter of routine fundraising and the necessity to set up a limited liability company under which all the fundraising activities are handled to keep in line with the IRS Code regarding 501(c)(3) church entities. Bingo was suggested, Patty is gathering necessary information on the legal issues as there are some pretty strict regulations regarding Bingo and it would most likely have to fall under the limited liability company umbrella if pursued.

Financial controls were discussed in relation to requirements of the Insurance Board. Patty is getting the guidelines from the Insurance Board and will review at the next meeting. We will be reviewing all aspects of our accounting methods to make sure we are meeting the necessary requirements for the Insurance Board and General Accounting Standards and will make recommendations as needed. This is not a new requirement but a safety measure not only for the Church but the members filling these rolls.

Credit Card payment online & kiosk options. Patty is meeting with bank representative to update prior information she received and working on presenting to Committee next meeting and hope to roll out shortly thereafter with approval. And don't forget: ACH Transfer (regular automatic payments or one-time payments) directly from your Checking Account to St. John's is available for making your weekly or special contributions. To find out more, contact Reverend Wirrig or Patty Staley.

In New Business the Chairlift Repair/Replacement was discussed and based on the current quotes and requirements, we are looking at our options and sources of funding. Repair is not an option. Replacement brings with it several issues and added costs that are not included in the quote, including the potential for City to dictate additional ADA Compliance requirements during inspection for permitting for the replacement of the chairlift. Therefore the Committee was tasked with finding grants/funds as soon as possible to fund ADA Compliance and find a viable solution to the issue of the chairlift.

Reverend Wirrig has requested that the funds that he contributed to fund the Director of Family Life Ministry and that have not yet been used and are designated for payment of a bonus at year-end be reinstated into his salary as we have not yet hired for the DFLM position and such funds would have already been expended by this time had the position been filled. The Committee voted and agreed that the funds could be made available and will make such recommendation to Personnel and Council for the funds to be returned to Reverend Wirrig's salary rather than the year-end bonus.

One Call Now is up for renewal. It was discussed and since there are many other ways that the congregation is updated on various issues relating to the Church – cancellations, deaths, etc, the One Call Now system is not utilized enough to justify the continued cost. The Committee voted on cancellation of the One Call Now and the service will not be renewed.

Building uses. We are pleased to note that we are being contacted regarding space for use by different groups. This is very positive in that it not only means income but also the ability to reach others through our availability of space.

This is positive also in that it gives us an added benefit when seeking funds. Look for more information to come as new possibilities are explored.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned

The next meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee meeting will be on Sunday, June 11, 2018 at 9:00 a.m.
