The Budget & Finance Committee met Sunday April 8, 2018. Present at the meeting were: Patty Staley-Chair, Doug Goudy-Vice Chair, Nick Schumacher-Secretary, Jeff Gerrior-Treasurer, Ron Duckson and Reverend Wirrig. Debbie Watts was unable to attend.

The meeting was called to order by Patty Staley, Chair.

The minutes from the February and March 2018 meetings were reviewed and approved.

Jeff Gerrior reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the month of March 2018 noting that Offerings are up over 2017 for the month in the amount of \$1,695 and year-to-date \$6,088. Expenses were a little high due the gas bill being higher due the weather, the County Water/ Sanitation bill, the Security System Annual Inspection fee and cleaning supplies. The deficit is trending lower than budget and if we continue as we have this first quarter year end should be well under budget. Requests from Parking Ministry will be made to bring the RAMM Holding Account and the Organ Fund Account out of a deficit position and \$500 will be requested for the Discretionary Mission Holding Account. The \$25,000 request from the GBU Annuity has been processed and will be reflected in the April report. We received a \$473.52 dividend from Vanguard Wellesley Account. The Martial Arts group has made a donation for their use of space. On the Flowers Account we have received \$363.75 with expenditures of \$825.93 year-to-date reflecting a difference of \$462.18 – it was noted a portion of this could be attributed to Palm Sunday but it was not clear what portion might be from unpaid requests. In Parking Ministry Missions Paid, payment for the Monitors for the Sanctuary and the installation was paid in the amount of \$3,494.04.

In old business, it was noted that the Council Chair is working on appointing a lead person to work on the revisions to the Constitution and By-Laws while all Council Members are submitting recommendations to facilitate the revisions. Parking & Parking Ministry — as has been noted in the Tower Times Dragons Parking will now be handled by ABM. Cards have

been printed introducing ABM as operating the lots with funds still coming into St. John's for our missions. Council Members are volunteering during the first week or two alongside ABM staff to help ease the transition. The search is continuing for a new Administrative Assistant as well as a Director of Family Life Ministries.

In new business, Patty advised the committee that our focus at the next meeting will be updating Stewardship with a targeted presentation date of July rather than the previous September. The goal is to make Stewardship work as the Budgeting Tool it is meant to be and to make so that members are more comfortable responding to the request for information to help with budgeting.

We will also be diligently reviewing grants and other fundraising options. There were two grant sites that Reverend Wirrig has asked this Committee as well as Building and Property to review with respect to building matters. Patty also asked the committee to look for others as well as ADA Compliance and exterior maintenance are priority matters. If we pursue fundraising in any routine manner, it may be necessary to set up a limited liability company under which all the fundraising activities are handled to keep in line with the IRS Code regarding 501(c)(3) church entities. Bingo was suggested, Patty will look into the legal issues as there are some pretty strict regulations regarding Bingo and it would most likely have to fall under the limited liability company umbrella if pursued.

Financial controls were discussed in relation to requirements of the Insurance Board. For persons who are counting offering/funds and making deposits, we are required to have a two person system where no one person is conducting this procedure alone. Currently, Norm Newbauer and Betty Lou handle this on Tuesday mornings. However, should one or the other not be available, it was decided that if the Administrative Assistant is available he/she could fill in as the 2nd. If Administrative Assistant is not available, the next responsible parties would be any of the Members of Council that would be available to come in to assist. We will be reviewing all aspects of our accounting methods to make sure we are meeting the necessary requirements for the Insurance Board and General Accounting Standards and will make recommendations as needed. This is not a new requirement but a safety measure not only for the Church but the members filling these rolls.

Credit Card payment options. Patty is reviewing information received from the bank with respect to options for Online and other credit card payment options. We look to add a credit card payment option to the Website for those that want to give online using a credit card. Members can currently do payments using ACH transfer from their banks. If you need information on how to do that, contact the office or Reverend Wirrig. We are also looking to

possibly add a payment kiosk in the corner outside the office that would also be available for payments. An example would be that a Mission Moment is presented and someone wants to give but doesn't have enough or any cash and would possibly forget to bring back an envelope, that person might be more inclined to support the mission if they could swipe a credit card before leaving that day. Also, as we present ourselves out into the community more and someone wants to know how they can support the church but they don't carry cash or want to make a cash payment in support, they could be given a card that shows the online giving option. There are multiple possibilities that this could be used to increase giving and support of the missions of St. John's.

We, as a Committee, will continue to look at ways we can grow and improve our financial accountability to you the members of St. John's.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned

The next meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee meeting will be on Sunday, May 6, 2018 at 9:00 a.m.




WORSHIP REPORT
