At we transition from our current committee structure to that of more specialized teams, my goal is to facilitate any required changes in this record keeping in order that we meet our constitutional and legal requirements.

The Budget & Finance Committee met Sunday December 9, 2018, these are not formal minutes of the Meeting but submitted solely as our report to Council. Present at the meeting were: Doug Goudy-Vice Chair, Nicholas Schumacher, Secretary, Jeff Gerrior-Treasurer, Ron Duckson, Reverend Wirrig and Guests Norm Neubauer and Susan Kolze. Absent: Debbie Watts. Isaiah Ashba was invited but also not able to attend.

The meeting was called to order by Patty Staley at 9:19 a.m.

Minutes were distributed by Nicholas Schumacher from the October meeting and after review the Minutes from the October meeting were approved. Minutes from the November meeting will be presented with the December Meeting Minutes at the January meeting.

Jeff Gerrior reviewed the Treasurer's Report for the month of November 2018. Giving was up for the month of November versus last year \$1,429 and up year-to-date over last year by \$7,916. The checking balance is at \$22,059.22 (Endowment was made available to cover the remaining year end expenses but the entire amount is not expected to be needed). We will continue operating on a very tight budget and watching it closely but we are looking a finishing the year under the budgeted deficit amount if things continue as they are. The Year-to-Date is (\$44,090) well under the Budget of (\$65,096) – we are hoping it stays that way. A couple of minor adjustments were noted as addition errors under the Envelope Contributions and corrected figures were given to the committee. Expenses were all administrative and very little committee expense was reported. We did receive payments for the ESOL space which aided in the income for the month in addition to the regular giving. Office Supplies was up as a result of the need to purchase a new computer system due to the crash of the older system. This expense was under \$500.00. Parking Ministry Missions Paid totaled \$565.00 to Lorenz and will be last payment out of that account as parking was moved into the general fund. An account will be set up for future expenditures related to parking as the need arises.

Patty presented a review of the items that Committee has worked on, the status of each and what the focuses will be for 2019. Parking was presented by Reverend Wirrig who stated that we will be continuing to work with ABM for Dragons and Special Events parking but we will possibly supplement some events parking with congregation members in an effort to cover times that ABM does not anticipate being able to provide coverage (Celtic Festival, etc.). We are also looking at leases with some of the local businesses and hope to have that finalized very soon as well as other parking ideas.

The Budget and Constitution proposals were approved by the Congregation, Stewardship was a success as giving is up, the Choir has grown and talents as being used and the various community projects the Church is involved in. Hopefully Stewardship will continue to grow and evolve to be a working tool for Budget and Finance. The Director of Family Life Ministries position was filled and it was decided that the Administrative Assistant Position would remain unfilled until such time as the need it present to fill the position. Financial Controls – after Isaiah is comfortable with taking over the Treasurer position, Patty will meet with everyone involved in the finances to review roles, practices and policies to make sure we are meeting requirements and controls are being maintained. Patty, Isaiah, Susan and Reverend Wirrig will review the computer system as it is and determine what back-up systems need to be in place, if any other updates of hardware and/or software needs exists, if the current accounting system is the most efficient or if there is something better that will meet the needs of the Church. Patty is meeting with bank representatives on Monday to move forward with the online Credit Card option as well as getting the Kiosk in place for taking credit card donations in the Church for those that prefer not to carry cash or to just be able to use a credit card for making contributions and for missions giving without having to take an envelope and remember to bring it back. Revered Wirrig obtained a number of grants this year and the committee was off to a great start on researching grants and fundraising.

For 2019, the focus of the committee will be more on the grants and fundraising. Patty will try to meet with anyone interested and/or with fundraising ideas sometime in January – hopefully was can find people who would be interested in being on an ad hoc committee that could roll into the new Fundraising Team Structure as the new Constitution phases into place. The fundraising team will work with the Budget & Finance Team but will be responsible for Stewardship and Fundraising. We will need to form a single purpose entity solely for fundraising to keep funds tax free under our 501(c)(3). Patty will have the IRS Form 1023 to Reverend Wirrig hopefully next week for review so it can be filed allowing. This is filed with the IRS and gets us the actual determination letter and electronic listing as an official 501(c)(3). We are grandfathered in under the Church categorization but most foundations, etc. want the official determination letter and/or for you to be on the electronic "approved" listing to apply for grants and funds.

Grants and other fundraising efforts will be focused on obtaining and/or providing funds for: the painting of the outside of the Church which was approved by the Congregation to come from the endowment with the understanding that funds will be raised to replace the funds used for this project. Further efforts will also focus on chair lift, elevator and/or partial or full ADA compliance as funds are available. On the whole, the Committee accomplished a lot over the last year but we still have a lot of more ground to cover.

We say goodbye to Doug Goudy who will be leaving the Committee to assume the role of Council Chair. Jeff Gerrior is retiring as Treasurer. We welcome Norm Neubauer who is replacing Doug and Isaiah Ashba who replaces Jeff as Treasurer. Susan Kolze joins the committee in a support role with her background focus in IT (information technology/computers).

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:58 a.m.

The next meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee meeting is set for January 6, 2019 at 9:15 a.m.
