Budget & Finance Committee Tower Time Article – January 2018 Meeting

The Budget & Finance Committee met Sunday, January 6, 2019. Present at the meeting were Patty Staley-Chair, Jeff Gerrior- Out-Going Treasurer, Isaiah Ashba, Incoming-Treasurer, Nick Shumacher, Secretary, Debbie Watts and Norm Newbauer. Absent: Ron Duckson.

The meeting was called to order. The Committee reviewed and approved the November Meeting Minutes. The December minutes along with the January Minutes will be reviewed at the February Meeting.

Jeff Gerrior presented the Treasurer's Report for December 2018. Giving for the month fell behind last year by \$770 but for the year was up by \$7,146. Operating Income for the year was up over budget and expenses lower than budget with the year to date deficit at (\$39,120) considerably less than the budgeted (\$65,096). Checking account balance is at \$27,452.95 giving us a good start for 2019. General Fund Investments are at \$165,355.61 and the Memorial Endowment Investments at \$53,467.40 with Total Assets at \$246,275.96. Missions have been paid. Clarifying Missions, the budgeted amounts are set aside in the event specific missions giving does not reach the budgeted amount, then the amount held in the budget would be used to make up the difference so no mission receives less than \$200 (the budgeted amount) but could receive more if giving is more than the \$200 budgeted. All amounts contributed to the designated missions goes to those missions, so if they go over the budgeted amount that entire amount goes to the mission. Christmas Giving totaled \$1,379. The Percy Jones Scholars for Sacred Choral Music balance is currently \$440. Dividends from the Wellesley Fund of \$4,187 and General Fund – MS Dividends of \$309.50 were received as was a \$6,000 donation from the Developer for the Building at the corner of 3rd and Sears to extend the period for negotiation of a parking lease. Donations from MJ's and Square One totaling \$600 were received and distributed to St. Vincent DePaul. Christmas Tuning for the organ was paid totaling \$930.02 as were a few other miscellaneous maintenance expenses. In all, we ended 2018 in a better position than 2017 and if we keep up the momentum, we can look forward to a very positive 2019. Let's work together to make that happened.

Old Business was lightly touched on as the Constitution and ByLaws were passed at the November Congregational meeting along with the Budget – now our focus in those areas are to work toward implementation Stewardship will hopefully transition to an ad hoc fundraising committee that can grow to a new Fundraising Team. Patty will work to seek out people and work with the group to make this happen.

Expectations/Roles of the Committee also were briefly discussed with Nick Schumacher volunteering to remain as Secretary with the full support of the Committee. Patty will reach out to Ron Duckson to see if he will serve as Vice Chair.

Financial Controls were also briefly discussed with Patty and Isaiah meeting soon to go over his transitioning into the Treasurer role and what other control measures will need to be reviewed and implemented once he is in place.

Form 1023 Status – Patty is transitioning employers and will get this through as quickly as possible. She will also meet with Isaiah to make sure he is part of the process.

Unfortunately, the Committee ran out of time and was not able to complete many items on the agenda so those items will be part of the February meeting.

It was discussed and decided that meetings of the Budget and Finance Committee will move to 6:30 pm the Monday just prior to the Wednesday Council Meetings.

The next meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee will be Monday, February 11, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

You are welcome to join us at the next meeting if you would like to get to know more about what we do and how the Committee functions. You may come as a guest, however if you have something to be discussed, please let me know so you can be added to the agenda.

But there were some of us who did have the opportunity to watch and enjoy the flakes glide through the air and brush the ground white with a stillness, grace and beauty.

The major news for January from the Building group was snow and more snow with a bit of ice. A great BIG THANK YOU to Steve and his diligence stay after the parking lots and walkways. The safe conditions were great appreciated by a wedding the first weekend. The ESL classes continued, and the walks were safe. The following weekend was a battle of extreme cold temperatures, rain, snow and then ice. Thank you, Steve.

Discussions continue with the Women of St. John's concerning the dish washer in the kitchen. We are seeking a sustainable resolution applicable to our needs, environmentally friendly and practical. The goal is to have equipment in place by March assuming we can coordinate all the various parts of this project.

The drain on the east side was attached but water continues to find it way into the ceiling and down the wall which is causing the problem in the stairway basement wall. Continued inspection is necessary to find the source of the leak. Once repaired we can move forward with repair of damage both visible and behind the wall to roof.

Plumbing problems continue to surface relating to the furnace or structure drainage. The plumbing and heating systems are long-range issues. The most immediate needs are fixed to make it through the cold season. In the meantime, attempting to develop a reasonable long-term solution.

During this cold season we are planning to plan. This means a careful examination of needs. This would be both short- and long-term. The goal is to have a broad-brush draft ready to Council (and Congregation) review in April. But priority remains to keep up with the immediate needs to maintain services and do no permanent harm to the building. Thank you to the many who assisted in the decorations for the holiday season, cleaning the storage area and storing the decorations over the past month. Thank you to the Building group members (and others) who committed several Saturdays to this process. Again, thank you to Steve Boggs for his continuing support.
